St John's Gospel, Chapter 3, verse 16.

- 3 Some of the people who saw "Jn 3:16" looked it up in the Bible, and realised that the words were appropriate for an event that was being watched around the world. This is what the passage from St John's Gospel says:
- 4 "God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost, but may have eternal life."
- 5 The same passage appears in all the many languages in which the Bible has been translated.

6 In French:

Car Dieu a tant aimé le monde qu'il a donné son Fils unique, afin que quiconque croit en lui ne se perde pas, mais ait la vie éternelle

7 In German:

Denn so lebte Gott die Welt, dass er seinen eingeborenen Sohn hingab, damit jeder, der an ihn glaubt, nicht verlorengehe, sondern ewiges Leben habe.

8 In Italian:

Dio ha tanto amato il mondo da dare il suo unico Figlio perché chi crede in lui non muoia ma abbia vita eterna.

9 In Spanish:

Porque tanto am-Dios al mundo que dio a su Hijo único, para que todo el que crea en él no perezca sino que tenga vida eterna.

10 In Welsh:

Do, carodd Duw y byd gymaint ned iddo roi ei unig Fab, er mwyn; bob un sy'n credu ynddo ef beidio â mynol i ddistryw ond cael bywyd tragwyddol.

11. Let us pray:

God our Father.

your love for our world and for each of us individually is so great that you sent Jesus, your Son,

that you sent Jesus, your Son, to live fully as one of us.

May he lead us to live in peace and work well with each other to build your kingdom in our world which you love so much.
