- 8 enough fat to make about 8 bars of soap;
- 9 enough sulphur to rid a dog of fleas;
- 10 enough lime to whitewash a small shed.
- 11 Human beings, of course, are very much more than chemicals - we are individuals with feelings, talents, relationships, and a personal history.

I can think of some of the chemicals my body is made of and the way the different cells of my body interact, but I know how much more a human being really is.
