



- 1 In the 1930s John Dillinger escaped from prison in the United States, having been found guilty of murder and robbery. The F.B.I. identified him as “Public Enemy Number One”.
- 2 Knowing that the police and the F.B.I. had records of his fingerprints, he thought he would set about getting new fingerprints so that his presence would not be detected in future. He dipped his fingers and thumbs into a bowl of acid, and went through great pain until new skin grew. After a few weeks, Dillinger tested his new fingerprints - only to find that they were identical to his old ones.
- 3 No-one else will ever have the same fingerprints as me. Fingerprints are a sign that each person is unique and individual.

 *Oil or perspiration on the ridges that form fingerprints is often transferred as a person touches something. The use of chemicals such as gold particles, and laser treatment, can even highlight faint fingerprints that are a few years old. The 4 main fingerprint types are arch, loop, whorl, and composite. In November 1997, instead of continuing with prisoners giving their fingerprints by using ink, some British police forces adopted laser technology in scanning the fingers of people who have been arrested.*

 *“Genetic fingerprinting” is based on the unique DNA “profile” of an individual and, of course, has nothing to do with “fingerprinting” itself.*
