- 1 Diane Modahl was 5-times the British 800 metre champion, and also held a Commonwealth title.
- 2 She was one of the British athletes at the 1984 Olympic Games in Seoul, South Korea. Diane made it through the heats and became one of the eight to run in the final. Knowing that it could be a lonely experience for her, she prayed Psalm 23 quietly as she began to walk through the tunnel into the stadium itself.
- 3 As we listen to the words of Psalm 23 which Diane prayed, we can picture her walking in the darkness of the athletes' tunnel, approaching the light of the stadium:
- 4 Lord, you are like a shepherd to me, and so I have all that I need.
 You give me rest in meadows of green grass, and you lead me to flowing water where I gain new life and strength.
 You guide me along the way that is best for me.
- 5 Even when I walk in darkness and everything around seems like death, you are there, walking with me, and the promise of your love and faithfulness helps to conquer my fear.
- In the sight of those who do me down, you invite me to sit at table with you.
 There you offer me even more than I need, and you remind me that I am significant and special.
- 7 You call me to goodness and kindness

every day of my life, and your house will be my home my whole life long.

(Psalm 23)
